 Essential Air Service Docket OST-2003-14822

Dear Mr. Devaney:

At its regularly scheduled meeting on February 3, 2010, the Lebanon City Council unanimously voted to authorize a request to the US Department of Transportation (USDOT) to replace two of the six daily Cape Air flights to between Lebanon Municipal Airport (LEB) and Boston with two daily Cape Air flights to the Westchester County Airport (HPN) in White Plains. This proposal will maintain six daily Cape Air flights from Lebanon with no increase in Essential Air Service (EAS) subsidy.

Below is the motion that was unanimously passed by the Lebanon City Council:
MOVED by Councilor Liot-Hill, seconded by Councilor Sykes, that the Lebanon City Council authorize this change in the service contract with Cape Air and to replace two daily round trips between Lebanon and Boston with two daily round trips between Lebanon and White Plains, and to authorize the Airport Manager to forward a request for same to the USDOT.

The City looks forward to your confirming this proposed change in service from LEB. Please feel free to contact myself or Airport Manager Richard Dymant if we can be of further help.
